Academic

APT completed its 16th year in operation, with the high school graduation rate of its graduates climbing to 99% and the college graduation rate of its graduates climbing to an outstanding 43%.

The 2019 commencement speaker was Rontavian Mack, from the inaugural graduating class of APT (2007). Mr. Mack went on to graduate from Berkeley Prep (2011), the University of Central Florida (2015), and the University of Florida College of Law (2018). Mr. Mack is now a member of the Florida Bar, and is an associate attorney with the prestigious Tampa law firm of Bush Ross, PA. A community leader now in his own right, Rontavian Mack is the Academy Prep mission coming to fruition.


National Assessments

Iowa Assessments are taken by all enrolled students each year at APT. Below you will find the average scores for each academic year for the class of 2019 beginning in grade 5. Academy Prep Tampa grade 5 students take the Iowa Assessment at the beginning of the academic year and then again at the end of the year. All subsequent years the students take the assessment at the end of the year. These scores are percentile rankings. Please note that the 50th percentile translates to students being at grade level in each category. For example, in grade 5 the average percentile for all students taking the Iowa Assessment was 56.

 - In 2018-19 APT partnered with a community counseling service (Chrysalis Health); now providing additional and regular counseling services for 22-24 students per year.
