GRADUATE GREAT is an educational collaboration that brings local schools together to create clear and unobstructed paths to graduation and higher education for every student.

- Focuses on students from income constrained families
- Teachers and schools work together from preschool through high school
- Provides rigorous, college preparatory academics AND professional work experience



Cultivating quality students

• 50% of ninth graders and 50% of the total student body at Cristo Rey will come from partner schools.



Advancing academic excellence

- An average of 70% of students will **perform at or above grade level** in reading and 50% in math on standardized assessments across all schools and all grades.
- Cristo Rey students from partner schools will achieve an average **GPA** greater than 3.0.
- Cristo Rey students from partner schools will achieve the national average **PSAT** score (860 for ninth graders, 910 for 10th graders, 970 for 11th graders) and an average **SAT** score of 1210 for 12th graders.
- 50% of Cristo Rey students from partner schools will participate in dual enrollment.
- 100% of Cristo Rey Students from partner schools will **graduate** on time.



Preparing life-ready leaders

- 90% of Cristo Rey students from partner schools will attend a post-secondary education program.
- 25% of Cristo Rey students from partner schools will meet **Bright Future requirements**.
- 100% of Cristo Rey students from partner schools will have less than \$3,000 in annual out-of-pocket college costs.
- 85% of Cristo Rey students who go to a four-year college will stay enrolled and graduate (persistence rate).

Summary of Results: 2022-23



Graduate Great is increasing access to a college preparatory education for more students from limited economic means.

• In fall 2022, 61% of all ninth graders at Cristo Rey came from partner schools, and 50% of all students represent partner schools, meeting or exceeding program objectives and demonstrating the power of a partnership pipeline.



While students from partner schools have met some academic objectives, more work is necessary to achieve standards in reading, math and the PSAT/SAT.

- 3 of 5 partner schools have 50% or more **students on level in math.** 2 of 5 experienced declines in reading scores, with only one partner school meeting our 2023 objective
- Cristo Rey students from partner schools had an average GPA of 3.02, meeting the program objective.
- 98% of Cristo Rey seniors **graduated in May 2023**. The graduation rate for students from partner schools was 94%.




Students have a solid foundation to begin life after graduation.


- 91% of Cristo Rey seniors attended college after graduation. Just 6% met Bright Futures requirements.
- 88% of students from partner schools had \$3,000 or less in out-of-pocket expenses per year to attend college.

In fall 2022, 61% of ninth graders entering Cristo Rey and 50% of all students came from Graduate Great partner schools






ENROLLMENT CONTRIBUTION NUMBERS ARE FROM FALL 2022.




ADVANCING ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

2 of the 5 partner schools experienced declines in <u>reading</u> scores, with one partner school exceeding our 2023 objective





In <u>math</u>, 3 of the 5 partner schools increased their scores, exceeding our 2023 objective

The average GPA for students at Cristo Rey who came from partner schools was 3.02 exceeding the program's >3.0 objective







The average SAT score for Cristo Rey seniors from partner schools lags the all-student average and national standard











The plan forward



Cultivate quality students

- Add St. Peter Claver in 23-24 and Corpus Christi in 24-25 to maintain enrollment goals.
- Better support partner schools with processes, communication and prospect identification.
- Continue convening teachers to collaborate and align on consistent curriculum and instruction that will set students up for success at Cristo Rey Tampa; focus on both academic and emotional intelligence.
- Work more closely with families to increase awareness and understanding of Cristo Rey's value.




Advance academic excellence

- Continue with the Silicon Valley Math Initiative for Cristo Rey to improve student outcomes in math.
- Focus more deeply on emotional intelligence for overall achievement.
- Increase student support from partner schools with the transition/adaptation to high school.
- Begin preparing students for the PSAT, SAT and college benchmarking in ninth grade; start advising earlier.
- Offer dual enrollment to all who are ready.



Prepare life-ready learners

- Focus on a scholarship assistance strategy to reduce annual out-of-pocket college tuition costs.
- Track progress beyond high school to view long-term student success and lives changed; communicate that story to funders, partners, community leaders and families.
- Increase number of students who meet Bright Future requirements to reduce out-of-pocket college costs.
