Increase Kindergarten Readiness

- All partners will meet the **state-mandated CLASS** score of 4.0, with a goal of 5.5 or higher.
- 90% of full-time and 70% of part-time 4-year-old VPK and PEEPS students at partner schools will score at or above level on the end-of-year STAR assessment.



Strengthen Educational Pathways to Kindergarten

- At least 60% of students from Corr's 4-year-old programs will stay for kindergarten.
- At least 35% of students entering kindergarten at Corr Elementary will come from partner schools.



Advance Student & School Achievement

- At least 50% of Corr Elementary kindergarten students will score at or above level on the beginning-of-year STAR assessment.
- At least 70% of Corr Elementary kindergarten students will score at or above level on the end-of-year STAR assessment.
- Improve Corr Elementary's third grade FSA score to 60%.
- Increase Corr Elementary's school grade from a C to an A.

2022-23: Results summary



Increasing Kindergarten Readiness

- Corr Elementary exceeded the CLASS score goal, receiving a 5.93. Kids R Kids received a 5.09.
- Although none of the Corr or Kids R Kids 4-year-old classes are meeting our objectives for **end-of-year STAR assessment** proficiency yet, they are well on their way, with Corr VPK nearly there.
- We found that end-of-year STAR scores for 4-year-olds may not be aligned with beginning-of-year kindergarten data. Only 36% of all Corr kindergarten students were ready for kindergarten. We are working to obtain data that demonstrates how all District students performed from the end of preschool to the start of kindergarten.



Strengthening Educational Pathways

- Corr Elementary increased its **PEEPS graduates who stayed for kindergarten** from 60% in 2021-22 to 71% in 2022-23. **VPK graduates who stayed** decreased from 50% to 38%.
- Partner schools served 106 4-year-olds, but only 25 from both schools stayed or went to Corr for kindergarten.




Advancing Student and School Achievement

- Corr Elementary's kindergarten proficiency was 36% in the beginning of the year and 57% at the end of the year.
- Corr Elementary's third grade FSA score was 40%, compared to the entire district score of 46%.
- Corr Elementary's school grade decreased from a B in 2021-22 to a C for 2022-23.

Corr Elementary exceeded our CLASS score objective of 5.50, while Kids R Kids fell slightly below




Corr VPK had the highest percentage of 4-year-olds who met or exceeded expectations on the end-of-year STAR assessment


More Corr PEEPs graduates stayed at Corr for kindergarten (71%) than Corr VPK graduates (38%)




About 1 in 4 Corr kindergarten students came from partner









2022-23 26% of Kindergarten Students Came from Partner Schools

Glossary: General terms



- Achievement: The percentage of students performing at or above the standard for their age or grade level
- Economically disadvantaged: Students who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch and Child Nutrition Program
- Gains: Students who show one year's worth of growth based on standardized academic assessments for their grade level
- Kindergarten readiness: Percent of students demonstrating readiness for kindergarten based on state (STAR) assessments

- Stability: The number of students who start and complete an academic year at the same school
- Stay rate: The percentage of students from a certain school boundary who attended on a given date (neighborhood, public choice or charter schools)



Glossary: Assessments

- CLASS: An observational tool used to evaluate teachers working with children from infancy through age 5 to assess school readiness
- 4-year-old STAR: The state-mandated assessment that evaluates readiness for all children in private preschools and public schools
- Kindergarten STAR: The state-mandated assessment that evaluates kindergarten readiness for all children entering public schools

ACRONYMS

• N=: Total number of students

PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS

 PEEPS (Pre-Kindergarten Exceptional Education Preschool Services): Provides educational opportunities for children ages 3 to 5 who have special needs

• **VPK** (Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten): Free, state-funded pre-kindergarten program for 4 and 5-year-olds who reside in Florida; families must choose a half-day program for the school year or a full-day program for the summer



Understanding school grades

- Seven components determine an elementary school's grade based on third- through fifthgrader performance (science achievement is only included for fifth grade).
- Schools can receive a maximum of 100 points for each component.
- The percent of students who meet the criteria for each component equals the number of points received for that component.
- To calculate a school's grade percentage, add all the points received for each component together and then divide that number by 7.
