What success looks like

Program objectives by May 2026 | Great We Grow began in 2018-19

Engage More Caregivers

- Achieve "large increases" in caregivers' perceived **knowledge** in five child development focus areas.
- Achieve a 70% increase in behavior changes "a lot" as reported by caregivers in five child development domains.

Improve Kindergarten Readiness

- All partner classrooms will meet or exceed the statemandated **CLASS score** (4.0), with a goal of 5.0 or higher.
- 90% of VPK and Head Start students and 50% of PEEPS students will score **at or above level** on the end-of year STAR assessment before entering kindergarten.

Strengthen Educational Pathways

- Increase the 4-year-old stay rate to 75% at Morgan Woods and 80% at Town and Country.
- Increase the enrollment contribution of partner preschool graduates to 30% at Morgan Woods and 60% at Town and Country.

Advance Student and School Achievement

- Improve the percentage of kindergarteners who score **at or above** level on the beginning-of-year STAR assessment to 40% at Morgan Woods and 50% at Town and Country.
- Improve the percentage of kindergarteners who score at or above level on the end-of-year STAR assessment to 40% at Morgan Woods and 50% at Town and Country.
- Improve the percentage of third graders who score at or above level on the FSA to 40% at Morgan Woods and Town and Country.
- Improve school grades at Morgan Woods and Town and Country from a C to a B.

Enhance Out-of-School Programming

 Monitor the percentage of Boys & Girls Club kids reporting an optimal response on key domains in their annual survey, including adult connections, sense of belonging and perceived opportunities.

2022-23 results summary

Engage More Caregivers

- Caregivers who participated in Champions for Children's What You Do Matters program showed large increases in child development knowledge in 2 of the 5 focus areas.
- 55% of caregivers reported significant increases in self-reported **positive behavioral changes**.

Improve Kindergarten Readiness

- Three of our four partner schools received a **CLASS score** between 4.83 and 5.44.
- Three of five 4-year-old programs were between 86% and 95% at or above level on the end-of-year STAR assessment.

Strengthen Educational Pathways

- The 4-year-old stay rate was the strongest since program inception at Morgan Woods (76%) and Town and Country (70%).
- The **kindergarten enrollment contribution rate** from partners was 40% at Morgan Woods and 64% at Town and Country, exceeding program objectives.

Advance Student and School Achievement

- 21% of kindergarteners at Morgan Woods and 35% at Town and Country scored **at or above level** on the beginning-of year STAR assessment — a significant drop from the end-of-year 4-year-old STAR assessment a few months earlier.
- Kindergarten and third grade proficiency rates (percentage of students who scored at or above level on end-of-year STAR and FSA) were down and need attention.
- Morgan Woods and Town and Country maintained a C for their school grades.

Enhance Out-of-School Programming


 Boys & Girls Club kids reported an optimal response for adult connections at Morgan Woods (89%) and Town and Country (69%).

Caregivers reported large increases in knowledge in 2 of 5 child development focus areas

RESPONSES RELFECT CAREGIVERS WHO PARTICIPATED WITH CHAMPIONS FOR CHILDREN. TOTAL CAREGIVERS RANGED FROM 44 TO 54 RESPONDENTS.

After participating in What You Do Matters, 55% of caregivers reported significant increases in positive behavioral changes



Town and Country VPK achieved a CLASS score of 5.44 for 2022-23, exceeding our May 2026 objective




Cornerstone had the highest percentage of 4-year-olds who scored at or above level on the end-of-year STAR assessment







The plan forward

Engage More Caregivers

- Work with elementary schools to **recruit more caregivers to participate in Champions for Children programs** as a feeder to preschool partners.
- Focus caregiver marketing on school families.

Improve Kindergarten Readiness

- Continue a **facilitated community of practice** that brings partners together, including public 4-year-old teachers, a lead kindergarten teacher from both elementary schools and Hillsborough County Public Schools.
- Focus on new CLASS observations and STAR assessments for 4-year-olds while better understanding the alignment of learning objectives, curriculum, digital platforms and state assessments.
- Pilot the Frog Street curriculum to improve social emotional and academic outcomes.
- Add 3-year-olds to our pipeline strategy to provide two years to improve kindergarten readiness.

Strengthen Educational Pathways

• Ensure preschool teachers encourage parents to keep their children at partner schools for kindergarten.

Advance Student and School Achievement

 Advocate with school leaders and teachers to improve the end-of-year results for kindergarten and third grade assessments as well as school grades.

Enhance Out-of-School Programming

 Advocate with the Boys and Girls Club to focus on improving academic support for and integration with out-of-school programming.

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Glossary

Glossary

GENERAL TERMS

- Achievement: The percentage of students performing at or above the standard for their age or grade level
- Economically disadvantaged: Students who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch and Child Nutrition Program
- Gains: Students who show one year's worth of growth based on standardized academic assessments for their grade level
- Kindergarten readiness: Percent of students demonstrating readiness for kindergarten based on state (STAR) assessments

- **Out-of-school time:** Care provided to children after school and during the summer while caregivers are at work
- **Stability**: The number of students who start and complete an academic year at the same school
- **Stay rate**: The percentage of students from a certain school boundary who attended on a given date (neighborhood, public choice or charter schools)
- What You Do Matters: Free, six-week educational playgroup for children from birth to age 5 and their caregivers



Glossary

ASSESSMENTS

- ASQ: Ages and Stages Questionnaire A standardized screening test for children from birth to age 6 to assess their development in speech, physical ability, social skills and problem-solving skills
- FSA: The Florida Standards Assessment A test administered to students in grades three through 10 for English language arts (ELA) and grades three through eight for mathematics
- **STAR**: The state-mandated assessment that evaluates kindergarten readiness for all children entering public schools
- **CLASS**: An observational tool used to evaluate teachers working with children from infancy through age 5 to assess school readiness
