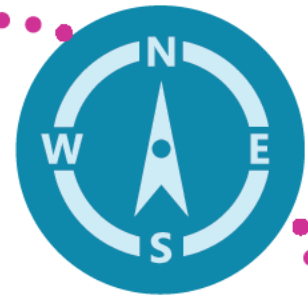
### Our Mission:

# EVALUATION OF DIRECT ENHANCEMENT SERVICES



## COMPREHENSIVE CONSUMER EDUCATION

Parents seeking childcare often face challenges finding a program that offers quality services, is convenient, affordable, and aligns with their educational goals for their child. In response, the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County's (ELCHC) Family Services Operations team developed a comprehensive strategy to deliver resources and support to families in need of childcare placement.

ELCHC's Intake and Eligibility Counselors, certified in Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) services, provide unbiased information and guidance about childcare options. CCR&R is a free service for all families in Hillsborough County, helping them identify quality early learning programs, explore financial assistance, and connect with other community programs and resources as needed.

In the 2023-2024 fiscal year, ELCHC's Intake and Eligibility staff provided in-person services at the ELCHC office, where the lobby remains a vital resource for families needing technology assistance to complete the online School Readiness (SR) and/or Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) application process. Virtual support was also offered to families, ensuring broad access to services. The ELCHC website offers comprehensive information about the School Readiness Program, including eligibility criteria, the application process, and provider listings, allowing parents and the public to access resources at their convenience.

### Family Support and Service Delivery: Average Response Metrics for Fiscal Year 2023-2024



**902 online submissions** related to Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) services.

**108,392 phone calls** from Hillsborough County families seeking information about School Readiness (SR), Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK), and additional resources for young children.

**5,135 families served in person**, with 90% receiving assistance within 10 minutes of arrival.

**90% of CCR&R calls and online inquiries** responded to within 24 hours by the Customer Relations Center.

ELCHC emphasizes the importance of family involvement in early childhood education, encouraging parents and guardians to actively participate in their child's learning through various events and initiatives.

## DAY OF PLAY

During the fiscal year, ELCHC hosted three Day of Play events in high-needs zip codes. These events provided parents with literacy and early childhood education insights while their children engaged in play. Families also connected with local resources such as Champions for Children, the Children's Board of Hillsborough County, and WIC.

## ON MY WAY TO KINDERGARTEN

The "On My Way to Kindergarten" program helps families prepare their children for Voluntary PreK (VPK) at age 4, ensuring a smooth transition to kindergarten. This year, the program hosted two major events, a Backpack Event and Trunk or Treat, where families learned about developmental activities related to key learning domains.

## COMMUNITY OUTREACH

ELCHC participated in over 100 outreach events in high-needs zip codes, focusing on literacy and providing information about ELCHC resources and programs. Additionally, in partnership with Bess the Book Bus, ELCHC hosted 30 "Joy of Reading" pop-up events at provider sites near transformation schools, offering valuable resources to both providers and parents.

# PROVIDER FINANCIAL SUPPORTS

The ELCHC remains committed to incentivizing and assisting providers in meeting childcare performance standards, implementing curricula, and offering professional development opportunities. These efforts are key to enhancing the consistency and quality of School Readiness Programs across Hillsborough County. In the fiscal year 2023-2024, the ELCHC embraced exciting opportunities to support the childcare provider community through several new grants. These workforce initiatives were aimed at recruiting, upskilling, and retaining Early Childhood staff and providers.

## V'locity Master Class and Accreditation Academy

This intensive, four-part Master Class series provided training on various aspects of business from community business experts, focusing on creating individualized business plans tailored to the specific challenges and opportunities of providing high-quality care and education for children and families.

### Participants:

Six Family Child Care Homes (FCCH) and six centers participated in a two-year process. An additional six programs participated in the Master Class for the first year only.

### Achievement Bonus:

Providers earned a \$1,000 achievement bonus and had the opportunity to work with a coach toward accreditation.

Accreditation options: Apple (FACCM) for centers and NAFCC for Family Child Care Homes.

### Eligibility:

The V'locity Master Class was offered to all 223 graduates of the "Invest in Your Future" business leadership training funded by initial ARPA Workforce grants.

### Total Awarded:

\$20,000 was awarded in total.

## Metropolitan Ministries CareCorps Initiative

This partnership with the Metropolitan Ministries CareCorps initiative provided professional development to Early Childhood interns preparing to enter the workforce. Participants received an achievement bonus, CPR & First Aid certification, and opportunities to participate in CLASS-focused professional development.

### Eligibility:

Participants were either residents of Metropolitan Ministries or at risk of losing housing.

### Total Awarded:

\$3,650 in total.

## United Way Quality Childcare Initiative

The Quality Childcare Initiative is a three-year partnership led by United Way Suncoast, in collaboration with the Early Childhood Council and the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County. The goal of the initiative is to improve outcomes for children attending childcare in areas with a high concentration of ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) families.

### Eligibility:

Staff at the chosen sites who complete professional development from a menu we provide were able to submit for achievement bonuses upon completion. Sites were also eligible to submit for a one-time bonus for improving their class scores.

### Total Awarded:

\$27,345 was awarded in total.

## Educator Tech Trainings

Providers were given the opportunity to participate in a series of technology trainings which included the basic functions of a computer, how to use different applications, AI related to classroom use and other related topics. Those who successfully completed the series were given the choice of a laptop or tablet to keep and continue their professional development journey.

### Eligibility:

Successful completion of course

### Total Awarded:

70 pieces of technology

## INCENTIVES

INCENTIVE\$ rewards teachers, directors and family childcare providers working with children ages birth to five with financial payments based on their level of education and sustained employment.

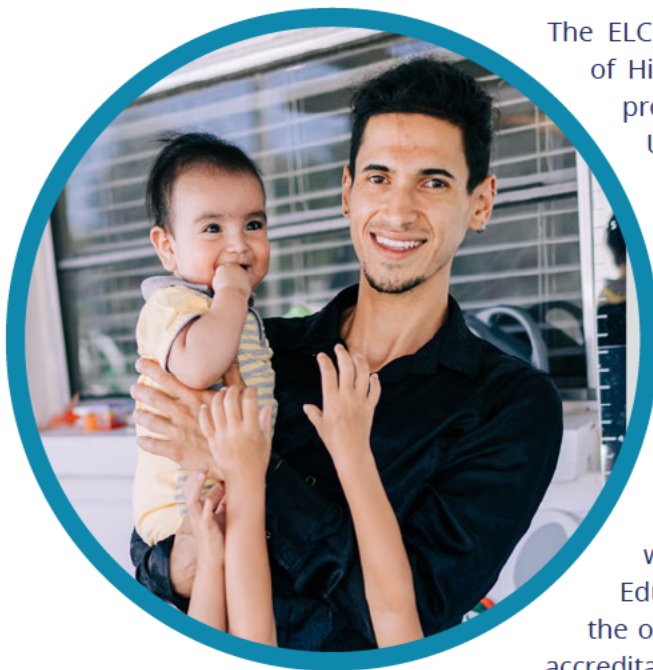
### Eligibility:

- Earn less than \$25.00 per hour as an early childhood educator in Hillsborough County.
- Work in a School Readiness or VPK contracted site
- Be employed for at least six months with children birth to 5 years of age for at least 20 hours per week.
- Have at least one of the education levels listed on the INCENTIVE\$ Scale.

### Total Awarded:

517 participating educators

## TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE



The ELCHC partnered with the Early Childhood Council (ECC) of Hillsborough County, University of South Florida (USF) program-wide Behavioral Supports, Florida State University's (FSU) 10 Components for Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers, Champions for Children, Florida Department of Education's Division of Early Learning (DEL), Frameworks, Teachstone, Redefiners World Languages and WEDU to offer over 150 virtual, in-person, and asynchronous trainings and learning events in English and Spanish, when possible, to our providers and families.

The ELCHC Education team also completed a tremendous accomplishment by becoming reaccredited with The International Accreditors for Continuing Education and Training (IACET). IACET is the developer of the original Continuing Education Unit (CEU) and acts as the accreditation authority allowing training organizations like the ELCHC to issue IACET CEU's. This accreditation is a rigorous process that required over 600 pages of documentation to be submitted for review in addition to a 2-hour site review, which resulted in the ELCHC receiving successful reaccreditation and the ability to offer IACET CEU courses through 2029.



Teacher’s Night Out 2024 at the Museum of Science and Industry Museum

Early learning teachers and professionals hold one of the most vital roles in our community: nurturing and educating our children. As we pursue our work, these dedicated educators focus on delivering high-quality early learning experiences, ensuring that our children are well-prepared for kindergarten and beyond. To honor and celebrate the significant impact that early learning teachers and professionals have on our children and our community, the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County hosted a special event designed to combine professional development with fun, play, and purpose.

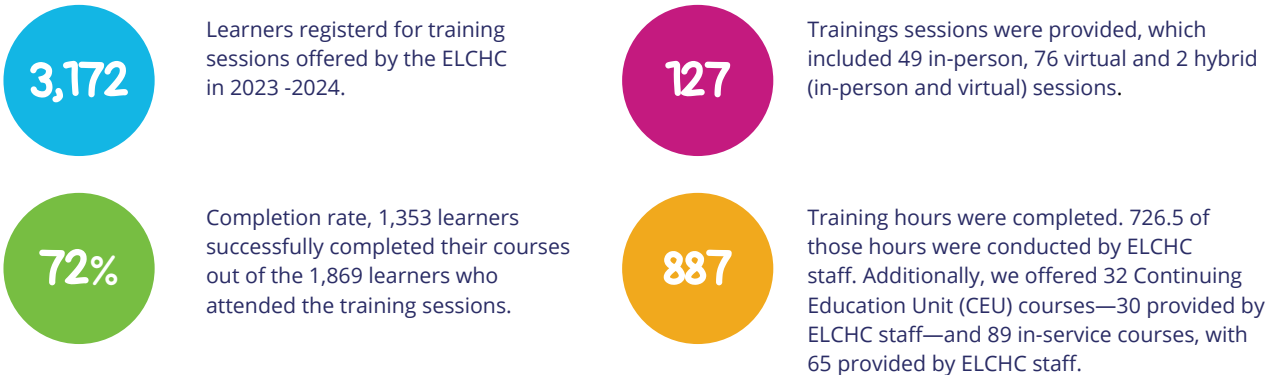
Teacher’s Night Out at the Museum of Science and Industry: Out of this World provided educators with a unique opportunity to reconnect with their inner child while exploring the museum’s interactive exhibits. These experiences offered fresh ideas that educators could bring back to their classrooms to enhance child outcomes. The event was a great success, with 221 guests including 1 ELC board member in attendance and 42 volunteers.

Technical Assistance and Coaching

Coaches completed 2190.5 hours of coaching and 99.67 hours of technical assistance in the following training and initiatives:

- **Jump Start Your CLASS:** A series of virtual and/or in person trainings that promoted high quality Teacher Child interactions and focused on using the University of Florida’s Lastinger Center’s Model for Coaching to support teachers in their classroom environments to improve depth duration and frequency of interactions.
- **Hillsborough Infant & Toddler Initiative (HITI):** Through the HITI program. Teachers work with their assigned coaches to choose which of the 10 Components they want to focus on. Using the pre component observation as a guide for coaching conversations with each educator. The intent is to increase scores when post observation is made.
- **MMCI CLASS Group Coaching:** A 12-session series, designed to support teachers in their environments to improve depth duration and frequency of interactions. Additional resources and materials were provided when available.
- **Literacy All Year:** On-site coaching and technical assistance centered on emergent literacy strategies was provided to teachers of three and four- year old’s in participating programs in addition, teachers were also provided coaching on implementation of resources and materials provided through their attended learning events
- **FSU 10 Components:** Centers with infants and toddlers were invited to join in training and coaching for directors and teachers. Directors and teachers chose one of the components and coaches used a pre component observation as a guide for coaching to increase scores when post observation is made at the end of the first of the two’s years of this initiative. Materials were provided to support areas that scored low on the CLASS tool.

## EARLY LEARNING STANDARDS

### Literacy & STEM Combo

This learning event is designed for new and veteran preschool teachers. Learners will learn how to create a literacy-rich environment that will also integrate STEM education preparing preschoolers for kindergarten. Learners will also have an opportunity to create developmentally appropriate literacy lessons & conduct STEM design challenges. Learners will receive copies of the NAEYC resource learning about language and literacy & NAEYC's Making & Tinkering with STEM and much, much more.

### Classroom with a Twist

Learners will learn how to prepare a classroom for optimal learning experiences and interactions using brain-based learning strategies while also creating positive affirmation signs for their environment.

### Toddlers and Centers

Please join us to learn how center time can be the most productive instructional time in your day. We will discuss how to set up, equip and use your classroom centers to engage Toddlers in play-based instruction and effective interactions.

### Baby, Let's Get Chatty!

This session will focus on the importance of communicating with infant and toddlers from an early age. Participants will gain an understanding of infants and toddlers' communication abilities and desires to connect with others. Participants will identify strategies to encourage the use of language while considering the natural progression of their development. Participants will enhance their knowledge by viewing videos demonstrating meaningful adult-child interactions during routine and play.

### ¡Bebe Hablemos de Todo un Poco!

Esta sesión se centrará en la importancia de comunicarse con los bebés y niños pequeños desde una edad temprana. Los participantes obtendrán una comprensión de las habilidades de comunicación de los bebés y niños pequeños y los deseos de conectarse con los demás. Los participantes identificarán estrategias para fomentar el uso del lenguaje mientras consideran la progresión natural de su desarrollo. Los participantes mejorarán su conocimiento a través de videos que demuestran interacciones efectivas entre adultos y niños durante la rutina y el juego.

### FSU 10 Components of Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers - Component 3: Environments for Learning

Participants will look at the importance of providing environments for infants and toddlers that support their unique developmental needs. The areas of focus will include comfortable environments, social-surroundings, thoughtfully planned caregiving settings, settings for exploration, opportunities for active movement & learning and fresh air living environments.

### FSU 10 Components of Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers - Componente 3: Entornos para el aprendizaje

Los participantes observarán la importancia de proporcionar entornos para bebés y niños pequeños que respalden sus necesidades de desarrollo únicas. Las áreas de enfoque incluirán entornos cómodos, entornos sociales, entornos de cuidado cuidadosamente planificados, entornos para la exploración, oportunidades para el movimiento activo y el aprendizaje y entornos de vida con aire fresco.

### Literacy in the Early Childhood Classroom

The Trainer will share ideas for incorporating literacy activities into the curriculum that promote early reading skills in young learners. Activities are based on Sesame Street and PBS properties and early learning research. Participants will discover ways to set a foundation for reading in the classroom; as well as strategies to share with families to use at home. The literacy training will also include a special section on Storytelling!

### Increasing Instructional Support During Circle Time

This training will focus on incorporating Concept Development, Quality of Feedback and Language Modeling into your circle time routines.

### School Preparedness

The presenter will discuss important school readiness skills and share relevant PBS digital resources. Providers will gain access to free, ready-to-use activities for student use at school and for families at home.

## Hook Them with Books

This learning event is designed for new and veteran preschool teachers. Learners will learn how to create a literacy-rich environment preparing preschoolers for Kindergarten. Learners will also have an opportunity to create developmentally appropriate literacy activities and materials. Learners will receive a copy of the NAEYC resource learning about language and literacy.

## Phonological Awareness Development for Preschoolers

This 3-hour instructor-led training is designed for VPK instructors and directors. Participants will have an opportunity to participate in hands-on activities supporting developmentally appropriate instruction in phonological awareness as well as explore the developmental stages of phonological awareness. The training is designed to complement the initial training Implementing the Florida Standards in Preschool Classrooms: 3 Years Old to Kindergarten and Emergent Literacy for VPK Instructors online course.

## Onset, Rime and Alphabet Time

This learning event is designed to discuss the many hands on methods for teaching emergent literacy skills including writing in the preschool years as well as the differences between phonological awareness and phonics skills.

## Comienzo, Rima, y Escritura Alfabetica

## Implementing the Florida Standards in Preschool Classroom: 3 Years Old to Kindergarten

The goal of this course is to support preschool teachers in implementing the Florida Early Learning and Developmental Standards, which is a comprehensive document containing age-appropriate information and reflections about how young children explore, create and think. Examples of developmentally appropriate instructional strategies for preschool age children are provided throughout the training along with information about purposeful planning, reflective practice and qualities of an effective educator. Through an

interactive presentation, video clips, and hands on activities, participants will become familiar with the Standards and understand the elements of quality instruction in preschool classrooms. The Standards are grounded in Florida's conviction that children's early experiences are directly related to later success in school, in workforce and in life.

## Usando vocabulario para describir

## CHILD SCREENINGS

### ASQ-3 en español

## Florida Training on the ASQ®-3 & ASQ®:SE-2: Part 1 Ages & Stages Questionnaires®, Third Edition (ASQ®-3) and Ages & Stages Questionnaires®: Social-Emotional, Second Edition (ASQ®:SE)

The purpose of this training is to equip professionals working with young children and families with the knowledge and skills necessary to effectively administer and interpret the Ages & Stages Questionnaires, Third Edition (ASQ-3) and Ages & Stages Questionnaires: Social-Emotional, Second Edition (ASQ:SE-2). The training will provide an overview of the Florida's screening requirements for the School Readiness Program along with the intervention process which include referral to assigned agencies and community resources. It will emphasize on the importance of positive communication with parents when addressing and discussing screening results. The training will promote the communication between parent/teacher relationship. Lastly participants will receive tools and strategies to educate parents about development age-appropriate milestones and how to support the child in the process.

## CHILD ASSESSMENTS

### Introduction to Teaching Strategies Gold

Teaching Strategies Gold is an authentic, ongoing, observation-based assessment system that

helps teachers and administrators focus on what matters most for children's success. This training will explore the basic gold platform which allows documentation to be added and used to track a child's educational progress.

## **CHILD DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH AND BEST PRACTICE**

### **Developmental Milestones for Infants and Toddlers**

When should an infant begin to roll over or sit up? How old are toddlers when they begin to feed themselves or say 50 words? Teachers and directors will learn about the different ages infants and toddlers should be at when they master a new skill using the CDC's updated developmental milestones. Teachers will learn about facts and statistics for early identification of areas of concern and how to talk to the parents about it. Teachers and directors will know what resources are available to them from the county.

### **Características del Desarrollo para Bebés y Niños Pequeños**

Cuándo debe un bebé comenzar a darse la vuelta o sentarse? ¿Qué edad tienen los niños pequeños cuando comienzan a alimentarse o dicen 50 palabras? Los maestros y directores aprenderán sobre las diferentes edades en las que deben estar los bebés y niños pequeños cuando dominan una nueva habilidad utilizando los hitos de desarrollo actualizados de los CDC. Los maestros aprenderán sobre hechos y estadísticas para la identificación temprana de áreas de preocupación y cómo hablar con los padres al respecto. Los maestros y directores sabrán qué recursos están disponibles para ellos en el condado.

### **Teaching With Respect: Strategies for Addressing Challenging Behaviors**

Respect is important in the interactions we have with all human beings, but particularly so with young children who spend much of their day in our classrooms. By using the Exchange article "Addressing Children's Challenging Behavior" as a starting point for information, discussion and activities, learners will come to understand what it means to teach with respect and how an environment designed around respect is important in the classroom. Learners will be encouraged to develop concrete ways to express respect and apply respectful strategies for positively guiding behaviors in their everyday interactions with children.

### **Behavior Guidance and Management for Toddlers and Preschoolers: Using Positive Language and Proactive Strategies**

"Stop hitting!" "No running!" "Don't bite!" These are familiar phrases many teachers say to children. This training will review how the CLASS tool defines Behavior Guidance and Management for children and different behavioral strategies teachers can use to build relationships by using positive language and proactive strategies with children to reduce inappropriate behaviors and improve learning.

### **Preschool Social Studies**

Please join as we explore how to apply social studies concepts to the preschool classroom environment with intentional learning and experiences. Topics will cover how to incorporate the main themes of social studies such as culture and identity within your classroom, all while challenging us to view our classrooms with an equitable, inclusive lens.

### **Toddler CLASS and Supporting Independence**

What is the connection between encouraging toddlers' independence and helping them develop important basic skills? Toddlers need many meaningful opportunities to make decisions, develop responsibility, practice self-care skills and engage with other toddlers. This interactive course is designed to give learners strategies to facilitate toddlers' competency in navigating and exploring their world. Using Toddler CLASS Dimensions as a guide, learners will explore how to adapt their current classroom practices and increase the intentionality of their interactions with children to effectively promote autonomy and success in the classroom.

### **Managing Behavior with a Creative Mind and a Playful Spirit**

Sooner or later every child experiences difficulty... for some it is a fleeting moment, for others the difficult behaviors spread into longer stages consistent with the issues of the child's development. The Exchange article "Hard Joys: Managing Behavior with a Creative Mind and a Playful Spirit" will be a starting point for discussing the uniqueness of children's 'signals' and recognizing different energy zones and how they apply to children's behavior. Learners will consider how 'energy zones' affect children's behavior. Learners will also discuss strategies and solutions for addressing children's needs based on the 6 tools for reshaping difficult behaviors.

## **Art Attack! Promoting Children's Creativity**

Creating is one of the highest levels of thinking and learning, yet often squelched in the child care setting. This learning event will help learners connect the provision of appropriate art experiences in the classroom with intentional, effective interactions with toddlers and preschool children (CLASS). We will review the developmental stages of art for children birth through 9 years of age and examine how this informs appropriate expectations for their artwork. Learners will compare teacher-directed projects with child-directed art experiences, discuss how each affects children's development and learning, and discuss strategies for facilitating children's creativity and free-expression.

## **Traumatic Experiences**

The training will focus on traumatic experiences that students may bring to learning centers and preschools. We will use PBS and Sesame Street online resources to identify different traumas that children may experience, the behaviors that may be present after or during trauma, and how to help these children cope. We will also discuss ways to work with families experiencing trauma.

## **Setting the stage: Building your Classroom into a Trauma Informed environment**

This training will explore the effects of trauma and how we can best set up early childhood classrooms for the best environment for all children to learn.

## **Seeds in the City**

This training consists of experiential learning through hands-on demonstrations and engagement in the material delivered to ECE providers on incorporating nature into the classroom environment. The development of the training is based on Cambourne's Conditions of Learning Theory, which states immersion, demonstration, and engagement are necessary to promote learners to develop a more meaningful understanding by collaborating to construct meaning and knowledge.

## **DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE CURRICULA AND CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT**

### **Creative Curriculum for Preschool 6th Edition – English**

This 4-day virtual learning event will be conducted on Zoom. It is designed to help teachers of all levels implement The Creative Curriculum for Preschool

6th Edition in their classroom. Teachers will become familiar with the 38 objectives for Development and Learning that inform every aspect of teaching. They will explore and practice using the knowledge-building volumes and daily resources. Through group discussions, activities, and homework assignments, teachers will learn how to implement a study, use Teaching Guides, create a lesson plan, and discover how to integrate content into daily events through intentional teaching experiences.

### **Introduction to The Creative Curriculum for Infants, Toddlers & Twos**

The training will explore the three volumes (The Foundation, Routines and Experiences, and The Objectives for Development and Learning) of the curriculum, that outlines the importance and benefits of a responsive environment and individualized care. The 38 research-based objectives will also enable teachers to focus on factors that are most important for very young children.

### **Frog Street Curriculum PreK 2020 – English**

Frog Street is a comprehensive, research-based curriculum that integrates instruction across developmental domains and early learning disciplines.

### **Frog Street Curriculum PreK 2020 – Español**

The path to language and literacy begins with interactions between adults and young children. In quality programs, teachers build language experiences within daily routines. When possible, teachers speak the primary or home language of the children. They respond to the sounds made by infants and toddlers and use words to give meaning to what children are expressing. Teachers maintain

a balance between listening to and talking with each child. Books and other print materials are available throughout the classroom. Shared reading is enjoyed daily, and families are encouraged to read with their children at home. Songs, nursery rhymes, finger plays, and pre-writing materials promote the development of language and literacy. This training will provide strategies to promote these early language and literacy for children birth to 36 months.

### **FSU 10 Components of Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers - Componente 8: Lenguaje emergente y alfabetización**

Caregivers promote the child's emerging sense of self and relationships with others and show acceptance and respect for all children. This training will provide strategies to support children's relationships with adults, support for transitions, how to nurture young children during routines and provide responsive guidance.

### **FSU 10 Components of Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers - Componente 6: Atención activa y receptiva**

# QUALITY ACTIVITIES FOR INFANT AND TODDLER CARE

## THE HILLSBOROUGH INFANT & TODDLER INITIATIVE (HITI)



The Hillsborough Infant & Toddler Initiative (HITI) began its fifth year on July 1, 2023, for the 2023-2024 school year. The initiative aimed to increase families' access to infant/toddler care in their local communities and improve the quality of care that young children and their families receive. HITI targeted childcare programs in identified high-needs zip codes, newly operating school readiness contracted programs (less than a year), programs with 30% or more school readiness enrollment, and zip codes identified as childcare deserts, where there were few providers serving children from birth to two years old.

Programs selected to participate in HITI agreed to increase their enrollment of children from birth to two years old by informing parents about available slots in existing classrooms and/or opening new classrooms for one or more of the targeted age groups. They also committed to improving the quality of care by providing staff professional development, implementing family engagement activities, and offering supportive teacher-child interactions in safe, age-appropriate learning environments.

These goals were supported by the ELCHC through coaching, technical assistance, provision of safe and appropriate classroom furnishings, equipment, materials, and stipends for professional development and coaching to encourage staff retention.

Each year, new programs were recruited for HITI, and programs that participated in previous years could continue on a limited basis. During the 2023-2024 initiative year, nine childcare programs (five Family Child Care Homes and four center-based programs) joined HITI, while eight programs agreed to continue their participation.

During the year, eight new infant/toddler classrooms were opened, and 12 environments were enhanced with safe, age-appropriate materials, furnishings, and equipment. A total of 95 infants and toddlers were enrolled in the nine participating programs from November 2023 to June 2024.

HITI sponsored family engagement activities in participating childcare programs on a voluntary basis. These activities included "Anytime is 3Ts Time," "Game Time with Dad," "Forever My Baby," and a community baby shower. Parents who participated in these activities were eligible to receive the Preschool to Home Library for Infants and Toddlers.

The ARPA Infant and Toddler Expansion Grant provided \$15,000 incentives for each new infant, toddler, and two-year-old classroom opened after July 1, 2023, until the application end date of April 1, 2024. As a result, 45 new classrooms for children from birth to age two were opened during the grant application and approval period.

The ELCHC launched the 10 Components Project on July 1, 2023, to support program quality improvement efforts for infants and toddlers using Florida State University's 10 Components of Quality Care for Infants and Toddlers. Four early childhood programs with School Readiness Program Assessment (SRPA) scores between 4.0 and 4.5 were recruited to participate. Implementation team members were trained on both the assessment tool and the training modules required to execute the project.

Throughout the year, 32 administrative and infant/toddler teaching staff participated in the project, with 23 participants remaining at the end of the first year, which concluded on June 30, 2023. The 10 Components implementation coaches conducted a total of 145 coaching visits, each lasting at least one hour. The 10 Components training courses were offered twice during the Fall and Spring of 2023-2024 and were available to both participants and the broader early childhood community. During the year, 152 training certificates were issued to project participants, and 22 of the 23 participants earned year-end incentives based on their level of participation in coaching, training completion, and pre/post 10 Components assessment tool results.

The ELCHC also sponsored five family engagement activities at the four 10 Components Project sites using ARPA Discretionary Funds. These activities included the Preschool to Home Library for Infants and Toddlers, "Sippy Cups and Paint," "Game Time with Dad," "Forever My Baby," a baby shower, and end-of-year parent surveys. "Anytime is 3Ts Time" was promoted in the programs, allowing children and families to earn books through the Preschool to Home Library by submitting their 3Ts certificate after completing the online modules.

The Preschool to Home Library for Infants and Toddlers (PHLIT) was implemented for its second year in HITI and 10 Components Project sites during 2023-2024. The project aimed to support infant/toddler literacy and bridge the gap between preschool and home by providing book bins and books to families who participated in family engagement activities at their child's preschool. During 2023-2024, 93 book bins and 436 books (109 sets of four books each) were issued to infants and toddlers to help create home libraries.

The iSpy Tampa Bay program was designed to introduce and engage young learners in the exciting world of STEM, equipping them with foundational skills and knowledge that support their academic and career trajectories. During the 2023-2024 fiscal year, iSpy Tampa Bay reached 38 programs, with 751 children participating. Of the 38 programs, 19 were invited back for another year of participation. Teachers and directors involved in iSpy Tampa Bay were provided with materials to support loose parts play, specialized training to effectively teach STEM topics, and workshops through the Communities of Practice to help them integrate STEM concepts into their lesson plans and classroom activities.

This year, iSpy Tampa Bay introduced coding and robotics into preschool classrooms. The addition offered robot starter kits, professional development, and various activities for classroom implementation. Through special funding, 36 teachers from 19 different childcare sites currently participating in iSpy Tampa Bay were invited to take part in this new initiative.

Participating teachers received one robot, supplemental materials to encourage critical thinking, classroom libraries to support STEM-based lessons and storage for the materials. Through hands-on training, educators learned how to use the kits effectively, fostering creativity, problem-solving, and critical thinking in preschoolers. The program also provided ongoing support to ensure sustained engagement and successful implementation in the classroom.

Classroom environments were enhanced with new materials and equipment, and annual passes to local attractions such as Zoo Tampa, Glazer Children's Museum, the Florida Aquarium, and MOSI (Museum of Science and Industry) were provided. These passes allowed children and teachers participating in the program, along with up to four family members, to visit the attractions throughout the year. The professional development aspect of iSpy Tampa Bay aimed to nurture critical thinking, problem-solving, creativity, and collaboration skills through hands-on activities and projects.

Through the iSpy Tampa Bay program, teachers and directors completed over 330 hours of professional development, and 77 classrooms received STEM-based materials to enhance learning and the classroom environment. The partnering attractions were visited by providers and families over 900 times between January and June 2024. A total of \$45,240 in stipends was issued to teachers and directors for their successful completion of the program.

## ON MY WAY TO KINDERGARTEN (OMW2K)

The OMW2K program consisted of two main components: the 5 for 5 Challenge and Literacy All Year. The 5 for 5 Challenge was designed to provide families with quick 5-minute activities in five key learning domains, helping to bridge learning at home. The Literacy All Year initiative aimed to create home libraries for children while equipping preschool teachers with literacy materials and training to help close the literacy gap, preparing children for kindergarten entry. This initiative also fostered community partnerships with neighboring elementary schools through a Zoom/Pen Pal program.

Four 5 for 5 community events were hosted for families and providers, with one event held at the Coalition and three others in partnership with local schools and the Day of Play. These events provided books to children and hands-on activities to support learning at home in five domains: Physical Development, Literacy, STEM, Social Studies, and Social-Emotional Development. Children and families took home these activities and books while connecting with community vendors. The final 5 for 5 Challenge event provided 350 backpacks to rising kindergarteners and drew over 165 attendees.

In the 2023-2024 contract year, participation in the Literacy All Year program increased. The initiative onboarded 34 programs, encompassing 50 classrooms for four-year-olds and 50 classrooms for three-year-olds. Classrooms received Big Book stands, a set of 10 Big Books, a fully stocked listening center with hardware, and lesson plans to accompany each Big Book. Additionally, children in the four-year-old rooms received home libraries with the same titles provided to teachers, along with take-home games to support hands-on literacy practice. Over 620 children received home libraries and a technology package, which included an Android tablet with a one-year subscription to Age of Learning™, a digital platform designed to support math and literacy education.

## SUMMER BOOST

The grant was designed as an extension to the Literacy All Year program to support programs in preventing summer learning loss for rising kindergarten students. This was done by creating a 4-week extension camp from June 1st to June 30th, 2024. Each program was provided a \$5000 stipend for materials, supplies, and activities that would support literacy and math. Programs were also provided with a summer curriculum and appropriate training. Teachers and assistants were also provided a \$5000 stipend. The program served over 500 children and 88 educators.

Additionally, we developed the *On My Way to Kindergarten* board game, which focuses on Kindergarten Readiness skills across five developmental domains: Language & Literacy, Social Emotional, Social Studies, Movement, and Mathematics & Sciences. The game is centered around the Hillsborough County area and features our iSpy Tampa Bay initiative and local community partners, making it a unique tool to engage children in learning while connecting them to their local surroundings.

Families and teachers were also given a Family Zoo Tampa passes, which will have lasting effects on children's learning by offering real-life experiences that they can transfer to their academics, from STEM to reading comprehension.

## JUMPSTART

The Jumpstart initiative comprised four Community of Practice sessions, focusing on the Infant-Toddler and Pre-K CLASS observation tool. Participants reviewed data from previous observations and received strategies to improve future observations.



The sessions focused on CLASS dimensions such as Positive and Negative Feedback, Teacher Sensitivity, Instructional Learning Formats, Productivity, Quality of Feedback, and Concept Development. A total of 164 providers and 218 teachers participated in the quarterly Jumpstart Your CLASS sessions. Providers who participated showed an average increase of 0.50 points on their CLASS scores, demonstrating the program's effectiveness.

## **VOLUNTARY PREKINDERGARTEN (VPK) COACHING COHORTS**

In the 2023-2024 contract year, the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County launched the Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) Coaching Cohorts, a new initiative in partnership with Bertelsen Education. The program consisted of four coaching cohorts—one for directors and three for teachers, each with 20 available spots. Over the course of eight weeks, participants engaged in live sessions and self-paced courses focused on the Renaissance FAST Star Early Literacy framework.

The coaching cohorts were tailored for VPK providers where at least 25% of students were identified as falling into the Urgent Intervention Benchmark based on the 2023-2024 Star Early Literacy Assessment. Teachers and directors were trained in literacy sub-stands, learning how to integrate these elements into lesson plans and use data to inform classroom decisions. Directors also gained expertise in guiding staff to incorporate literacy assessments into their teaching practices.

Among the 28 VPK programs that completed the eight-week coaching, 112 students who started in the Urgent Intervention Benchmark saw significant improvement. By Progress Monitoring Window 3, 50 students had advanced to the At/Above Benchmark. This remarkable progress underscores the impact of tailored coaching in improving educational outcomes and transforming early learning experiences.

Looking ahead to the 2024-2025 contract year, we plan to expand the VPK Coaching Cohorts to further enhance the lives of VPK children on a larger scale.

## **MONITORING**

### **PROVIDER SUPPORTS**

The ELCHC Provider Supports Team conducted on-site monitoring of contracted School Readiness and Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK) programs to ensure contract compliance. Consequences for noncompliance were determined according to the State of Florida Rule and law and the ELCHC's Progressive Enforcement Procedures.

Staff monitored each provider's program to ensure it met the terms and conditions outlined in the State of Florida Statewide Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten (VPK) Provider Contract (DEL VPK-20) or the State of Florida Statewide School Readiness Contract (DEL SR-20). The ELCHC monitored both private providers and Hillsborough County Public Schools (HCPS).

To prepare for these monitoring activities, the Provider Supports Team offered Technical Assistance (TA) to 118 contracted providers, conducting a total of 159 TA visits throughout the year. These visits often included reviews of required documentation, health and safety standards, attendance, and sign-in/out sheets.





# INCLUSION

The Screening and Support Services team at the ELCHC provides essential services to children in the School Readiness program. Each year, all children from birth through kindergarten entry are screened for developmental milestones and concerns using the Ages and Stages Questionnaire 3 (ASQ-3). The results are reported to the ELCHC for follow-up, which may include intervention support plans, additional developmental and behavioral screenings, or referrals for developmental evaluations to Early Steps or Child Find. To address the growing need for social-emotional and behavioral support, the ELCHC Behavior Support Specialists developed a program aimed at reducing expulsion rates within the early childhood School Readiness community.

This initiative allows the Screening and Support staff to create intervention plans that focus on the whole child and all areas of development.

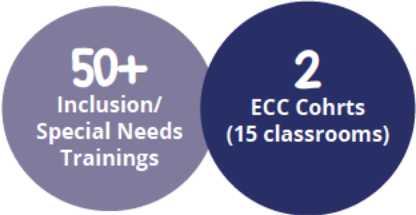
## WARM LINES SERVICES

The ELCHC offers essential screening and support services to families and providers through the Hillsborough County Warm Line. This service is available to all childcare centers, family childcare homes, and parents who need assistance with childcare arrangements or concerns about children with special needs. In the 2023-2024 program year, the Warm Line supported over 115 families and providers, offering guidance and resources to ensure children receive the care and services they need.

## INCLUSION EXPANSION PROGRAM

With funding from ARPA grants, the ELCHC Provider Supports team, in collaboration with community partners, launched the Inclusion Expansion Program. This initiative placed behavior experts in 11 locations across Hillsborough County to offer on-site intervention training, modeling, and strategy support. In addition to in-classroom training, participating educators completed 1,160 hours of outside required training during the six-month program. Providers received assistance with classroom setup, schedule creation, and sensory and classroom materials. Educators and providers were also given stipends to cover the costs of smaller classroom ratios, higher teacher wages, and participation in required trainings.

This program has successfully increased the number of inclusive sites in Hillsborough County and reduced suspensions and expulsions due to behavioral concerns. Additional training opportunities offered by the ELCHC included crisis management training, Touchpoints training, Rock Your Classroom trainings, and various sessions provided through PWPBS, HCC, ECC, and Champions for Children.



# COORDINATED SCREENING AND PROGRESS MONITORING FOR VPK PROGRAMS

The ELCHC ensures that all VPK programs implement the Coordinated Screening and Progress Monitoring Program using the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) Star Early Literacy. The assessment is administered three times during the program year: within the first 30 instructional days (PM1), when 40% to 60% of the instructional hours have been completed (PM2), and during the final 30 instructional days (PM3).

In the 2023-2024 program year, 9,302 children were assessed in PM1, with 68.45% scoring below the literacy benchmark and 31.55% meeting or exceeding expectations. Intervention strategies were provided for 15.65%, and 11.20% required urgent support. By PM2, the percentage of children below the benchmark dropped to 43.39%, with 10.36% needing further support. By the final assessment (PM3), the percentage of children below the benchmark had decreased further to 35.28%, reflecting continued progress across the year.

These assessments are integral to the VPK Provider Performance Metric, ensuring that providers track and support children's learning gains throughout the year.

## AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) DISCRETIONARY GRANT



The ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) Discretionary Grant made a significant and transformative impact on our early childhood local community through 26 strategic initiatives, totaling \$34 million. These initiatives directly benefited educators, early childhood programs (centers and family childcare homes), and families by offering financial incentives, promoting learning gains, and advancing the mission of the ELCHC to provide high-quality, equitable, and inclusive learning opportunities.

One of the key highlights was the direct financial support provided to 3,019 early childhood educators through our educator-targeted initiatives, with \$12 million disbursed.

This financial assistance was available to educators with at least one year of tenure at their program. It not only improved the livelihoods of our ECE professionals but also stimulated the local economy.

Notably, 1,640 educators received the maximum stipend of \$2,500 through the grant, underscoring the vital role they play in our community and the appreciation we have for early childhood educators at the Early Learning Coalition of Hillsborough County.

Educators also had the opportunity to apply for grants to offset rising medical costs, receive achievement bonuses for every eligible course successfully completed, participate in technology trainings, and attend self-care focused learning events, all with a \$2,500 stipend award.

The Playground Grant initiative was another major success, allowing centers and family childcare homes to apply for up to \$99,000 each to completely revitalize their outdoor play spaces. As a result, over 90 brand-new, age-appropriate, and safe play areas were established, ensuring that children in our community had access to engaging, secure outdoor environments. Programs that made a financial contribution to employees' healthcare were eligible to apply for up to \$55,000 to offset the cost of insurance. The Early Learning Coalition also provided spring and summer scholarships to enhance learning activities in programs.

Additionally, childcare centers that opened new infant and toddler classrooms received \$15,000 per classroom to assist with costs associated with preparing and launching new spaces to serve our youngest citizens and their families.

Families with children aged 2 to 12 years also benefited from ARPA through various grant opportunities, such as parent trainings, homelessness assistance, and family/home learning technology. Over 4,500 children received Android tablets with protective cases and child-sized headphones, along with an online home learning subscription, valued at over \$600. This initiative was specifically designed to prevent summer learning loss and support continued educational engagement at home.

These examples highlight just a few of the 26 impactful initiatives made possible through the ARPA Discretionary Grant. The grant not only enhanced the quality of early childhood education in our community but also provided vital resources and support to educators, families, and early childhood programs.

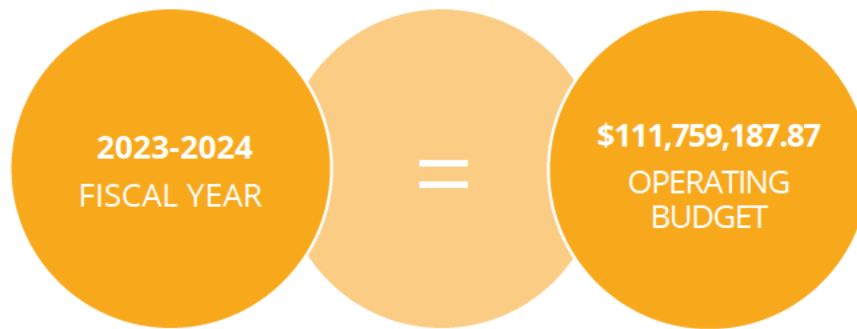
