Engage More Caregivers

- Large increases in perceived knowledge
- 70% increase in perceived behavior changes



Improve Kindergarten Readiness

- Minimum CLASS score of 5.5
- 4-year-old EOY STAR achievement before entering kindergarten (70% VPK/Head Start; 30% PEEPS)
- 55% learning gains for VPK
- 60% excellent and 100% above performance designation of VPK providers



Strengthen Educational Pathways

- 80% kindergarten stay rate for 4-year-olds
- Enrollment contribution of partner preschools (Morgan Woods 30%; Town and Country 60%)



Advance Student and School Achievement

- BOY STAR achievement for new kindergarteners (50%)
- EOY STAR achievement for kindergartners (50%)
- EOY ELA for third-graders (40%)
- School grade: B

Results summary for 2023-24

Engage More Caregivers

- Caregivers showed large increases in all five focus areas of child development knowledge.
- 56% of caregivers reported significant increases in **positive behavioral changes.** (Goal = 70%)

Improve Kindergarten Readiness

- Morgan Woods achieved a CLASS score of 5.58, exceeding our 5.50 goal. Town and Country VPK fell short with 4.74.
- 35% of 4-year-olds met or exceeded the achievement score on the **end-of-year STAR** assessments, with 2 of 5 classrooms meeting our objectives (70% VPK/Head Start; 30% PEEPS).
- 37% of partner VPK students achieved a learning gain score of 55%+.
- 50% of providers achieved an excellent **performance designation** per state accountability requirements. (Goal = 60%; 100% "above")

Strengthen Educational Pathways

- The 4-year-old stay rate decreased 20% at Morgan Woods and 6% at Town and Country, both below our 80% objective.
- The kindergarten enrollment contribution rate from partners was down at both schools and is still falling short of program objectives.


Advance Student and School Achievement

- 26% of kindergarteners at Morgan Woods and 23% at Town and Country met or exceeded the achievement score on the beginning-of year STAR assessment. (Goal 50%)
- The percentage of students who met or exceeded the achievement score on the end-of-year STAR increased at both schools, with Town & Country already meeting our 50% objective.
- Third-grade achievement in ELA was up at both schools yearover-year, with both meeting our 40% objective.
- Morgan Woods and Town and Country maintained a C for their school grades. (Goal = B)

Enhance Out-of-School Programming


Boys & Girls Club kids reported an **optimal response for adult connections** at Morgan Woods (81%) and Town and Country (63%), with more work to be done to achieve our 90% objectives.

Caregivers reported large increases in knowledge in all five child development focus areas



Morgan Woods VPK achieved a CLASS score of 5.58 for 2023-24, exceeding our program objective




CLASS OBSERVATIONS WERE COMPLETED AT PARTNER SCHOOLS DURING THE 2023-24 SCHOOL YEAR.

THIS CHART SHOWS 4-YEAR-OLD STAR ACHIEVEMENT SCORES AT THE END OF THE 2023-24 SCHOOL YEAR.
THE ACHEVEMENT SCORE WAS 707 FOR VPK, 635 FOR HEAD START AND 635 FOR PEEPS.












The plan forward

Engage More Caregivers

- Work with elementary schools to recruit more caregivers
 to participate in Champions for Children programs
 as a feeder to preschool partners.
- Focus caregiver marketing on school families.

Improve Kindergarten Readiness

- Continue a **facilitated community of practice** that brings partners together, including public 3 & 4-year-old teachers, a lead kindergarten teacher from both elementary schools and district staff.
- Provide additional resources in partnership with the Early Learning Coalition to support CLASS observations and STAR assessments for 4-year-olds.
- Continue support of the Frog Street curriculum and new progress monitoring system (Cognitive Toy Box).

Strengthen Educational Pathways

 Ensure preschool teachers encourage parents to keep their children at partner schools for kindergarten.

Advance Student and School Achievement

 Work with school leaders and teachers to improve endof-year results for kindergarten and third grade assessments as well as school grades.

Enhance Out-of-School Programming

Encourage Boys & Girls Clubs to focus on improving academic support for and integration with out-of-school programming.

Glossary

Glossary



GENERAL TERMS

- Achievement: The percentage of students performing at or above the standard for their age or grade level
- Economically disadvantaged: Students who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch and Child Nutrition Program
- Learning gains: Students who show one year's worth of growth based on standardized academic assessments for their grade level
- Kindergarten readiness: Percent of students demonstrating readiness for kindergarten based on state assessments (STAR)

- Out-of-school time: Care provided to children after school and during the summer while caregivers are at work
- Stability: The number of students who start and complete an academic year at the same school
- Stay rate: The percentage of students from a certain school boundary who attended on a given date (neighborhood, public choice or charter schools)
- What You Do Matters: Free, six-week educational playgroup for children from birth to age 5 and their caregivers

Glossary

ASSESSMENTS

- 4-year-old STAR: The state-mandated assessment that evaluates readiness for all VPK children in private preschools and public schools
- **Kindergarten STAR:** The state-mandated assessment that evaluates kindergarten readiness for all children entering public schools
- **CLASS**: An observational tool used to measure the quality of the interactions teachers have with children which impact learning and development from infancy through age 5 to assess school readiness
