

What success looks like by May 2026

Improve the Quality of Early Learning Providers

- Minimum CLASS score of 5.5
- Teacher credentials: 20% 45 hours; 40% Child Development Associate; 40% AA/AS or higher
- 100% nationally accredited
- 60% achieve excellent performance designation per state accountability requirements



Advance Student Academic Outcomes

- 70% 4-year-olds reach achievement score on EOY STAR
- Learning gains score of 55% or higher
- 80% Metropolitan Ministries students exceed average
 Post-NIH Toolbox score; 100% increase scores in all five executive functioning areas



Strengthen Educational Pathways

- 90% stay rate for 4-year-olds at Catholic preschools
- Kindergarten enrollment contribution from partner preschools:
 - Nativity: 50%
 - St. Joseph's: 85%
 - St. Peter Claver: 30%
- 60% will **transition** to B-rated school or higher
- 100% will **transition** to C-rated school or higher

2023-24 results summary



Improve the Quality of Early Learning Providers

- Two of 7 partner centers achieved a CLASS score of 5.5 or higher.
- Partner center teachers have achieved program objectives for hours and Child Development Associate credentials, while 35% have obtained their AA/AS or higher on the way to reaching 40%.
- 88% of partner centers have a national accreditation.
- 80% of partners achieved an excellent **performance designation** per state accountability requirements.



Advance Student Academic Outcomes

- 74% of 4-year-olds met or exceeded the end-of-year STAR assessment achievement score.
- 75% of partner VPK students achieved a learning gains score of 55% or higher.
- 88% of Metropolitan Ministries students exceeded the average score on the **Post-NIH Toolbox**, and 100% increased their scores in **all five executive functioning areas**, meeting program objectives.



Strengthen Educational Pathways

- 89% of 4-year-olds at Catholic partner preschools stayed for kindergarten.
- 43% of 4-year-olds at Catholic partner preschools enrolled at their school for kindergarten.
- 26% of partner students transitioned to B-rated elementary schools or higher, 96% went to C or higher.

Two partner centers exceeded our CLASS score objective of 5.5 for the 2023-24 school year



The plan forward

Improve the Quality of Early Learning Providers

- Each partner school will focus on ensuring all teachers have or are pursuing a minimum of a Child Development Associate credential, encouraging an Associate in Arts or Science degree or higher.
- Schools will use INCENTIVE\$ and TEACH Scholarships to encourage participation.

Advance Student Academic Outcomes

- Continue **bringing partners together** to improve end-of-year scores for 4-year-olds.
- Provide additional resources in partnership with the Early Learning Coalition to support CLASS observations and STAR assessments for 4-year-olds.
- Learn from K-8 schools how we can better prepare students for kindergarten.

Strengthen Educational Pathways

- Continue our "Navigating the Journey from Preschool to Kindergarten" initiative for 4- and 5-year-olds to engage and educate preschool parents about elementary school choices.
- Continue and grow **parent-engagement activities** at all center locations.

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Glossary: Assessments

- **STAR assessment:** State-required assessment that all private and public VPK providers must administer to children at the beginning, middle and end of a VPK program, to evaluate kindergarten readiness on performance standards in early literacy and mathematics
- NIH Toolbox: A set of integrated tools that measure cognitive, emotional, motor and sensory functions starting at age 3 among diverse cultures, ethnic and geographic groups; developed by the National Institutes of Health (NIH)
- **Gains:** Students who show one year's worth of growth based on standardized academic assessments for their grade level
- Kindergarten readiness: Percent of students demonstrating readiness for kindergarten based on state assessments



Glossary: General terms

- VPK: Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten: Free, state-funded pre-kindergarten program for 4- and 5-year-olds who reside in Florida; families must choose a half-day program for the school year or a full-day program for the summer
- School Readiness: A state-funded program that offers financial assistance to low-income families for early child education and care so families can become financially self-sufficient and young children can be successful in school
- Achievement: The percentage of students performing at or above the standard for their age or grade level
- Economically disadvantaged: Students who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch and Child Nutrition Program

- **CLASS:** An observational tool used to evaluate a teacher's interactions with children from infancy through age 5
- Accreditation: Indicates the level of quality whereby the provider demonstrates the capacity, commitment and competence to support high-quality learning and ongoing program improvement
- Gold Seal: In 1996, the Florida Legislature established the Gold Seal Quality Care program to acknowledge childcare facilities and family day care homes that have gone above the required minimum licensing standards to become accredited by recognized agencies whose standard reflects quality in the level of care and supervision provided to children. The Gold Seal is not an accreditation, but a voluntary designation for an accredited agency.
